is a Court of record Kelly McCornell  
a resident of the County of Macon in  
the State of Missouri aged Eighty seven  
years who being duly sworn according  
to law doth on her oath make the  
following declaration in order to obtain  
the benefit of the provisions made by the  
act of Congress passed 3<sup>rd</sup> of February  
A.D. 1833 That she is the widow of Johnathan  
McCornell deceased who was a pensioner  
of the revolutionary war and received  
annually Two hundred & forty dollars  
Said Johnathan McCornell deceased  
resided in Casey County in the State of  
Kentucky and drew his said pension  
at the pension agency in the City of Lex-  
ington in the State of Kentucky. She  
further declares that she was married  
to the said Johnathan McCornell deceased on  
or about the first day of August A.D. 1810 she  
does not recollect the exact day of the month

by one Harry Miller a minister of the Gospel  
that her said husband the aforesaid John  
an McCounell died on the tenth day of  
May A.D. 1829 That she was married to  
him about the time above stated she further  
swears that she was a widow at the passage  
of the act and is still a widow and that  
she has never before made any applica-  
tion for a pension she states that she made  
some preparation before the passage of the  
act aforesaid to make application for  
a pension but never applied to government  
she also swears that she has had an exami-  
nation made in the Clerk's office of the County  
of Casey in the State of Kentucky where she  
was married but could find no record of  
her said marriage she also swears that  
there is no private record of her said  
marriage

The Schedule and Affidavit of Jonathan M. Correll, Clerk  
Applicant for a Pension. Verified by his Oath & signed, and  
Ordered to be Read, and the same falling in their way,  
to wit, — Schedule, &c. Pulaski County Court doth.

On this twentieth day of November 1820 personally appeared  
in Open Court, being a Court of Record for said County, Established by the  
Constitution, and Legislature of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and  
having sworn to feed, and Inquire, and proceed according to  
the Course of the Common Law, Jonathan M. Correll, aged 70  
years, resident in said County, who being first duly sworn, according  
to Law, doth in his Oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary  
— may War as follows, On the first day of October 1776, he was  
appointed a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary war of the United States  
upon Continental Establishment, and was at Red Bank, Battle;  
in the Near Gun in the Attack from Fort Mifflin, and was at the  
Birmingham fight, and also at the taking of Burgoyne, and was  
at Fort Mifflin Fight, and was honorably discharged at Fort Mifflin  
in New York, having served but two years, he states that he has  
now Capt. M. Correll the Paymaster Commander by Capt. S. H. H. H.  
M. P. was stationed to defend the Fort, at New York, from the  
and also served a Certificate for a pension date 4<sup>th</sup> of  
December 1819. — And I do solemnly swear that  
I was a Resident Citizen of the United States, on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of



March, 1818. and that I have not, since that time, by gift  
sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part  
thereof, with intent thereby, so to diminish it as to bring myself  
within the provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act  
to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval  
Service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed  
in the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any  
person in trust for me, any property, or interests, contracts, or debts  
and to me; nor have I any interest other than what is contained  
in the Schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed; The Land  
and Slave of the Value of \$5 seven head of Cattle of the Value of \$56.  
about 30 head of Hogs of the Value of \$30 — 5 Chairs of the  
Value of \$1.50 pot metal \$8. Cupboards furnished \$2. Domestic  
Tools \$1. and the said Jonathan M. Cogswell, further stated that  
he is a day laborer. that he not able to work scarcely, owing  
to being injured, and also op, that he has no child, or children.  
he has a wife. about 50 years of age, and is nearly as person  
generally of that age

agreeably to an act of the Congress

was granted upon her Application for a  
pension from the State of Missouri, under 2<sup>d</sup> Section  
of the act of Congress - approved 3<sup>d</sup> February 1853,  
at \$320 per annum - as the widow of the said  
Jonathan McEnnis deceased, who was a pensioner  
at his death as Kentucky pension agent.  
On account of his services in the Revolutionary  
Army.

She further declares that she was married to  
the said Jonathan McEnnis in the county of  
— in the State of Kentucky - on the day  
of July A D one or about the year 1815 - the precise  
time not recollected and that her name before  
her said marriage was Kelly Lamb.  
That her said husband died in the county of  
Haley in the State of Kentucky as or about  
the — day of — 1829, and that she is still  
& now a widow or his widow - at the date  
of executing this her declaration - to prove  
the date and place of her said marriage.
