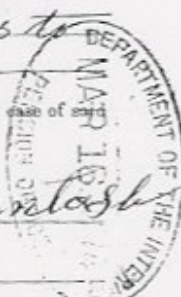



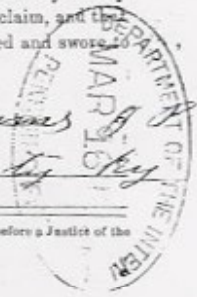

Dear Sir,

I have your card of yesterday, requesting me to say, of what disease Reuben Atney died, and if such disease could have existed at time of enlistment, or was contracted while in the service.

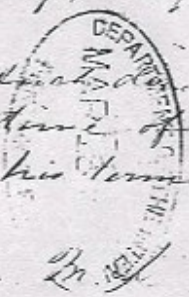
This disease was of a class common during the war amongst our soldiers, and of which I had many cases shortly after the coming of peace. Inflammatory, Rheumatic, condition of Hip joint, ultimately going into Paralysis with suppurative of the whole Femur; contracted without doubt in consequence of Cold, fatigue, and exposure.

This case was a very bad one, very badly conducted mostly by his own father. The lower extremity of the bone projected far through the tissues before death, requiring the use of Cutting Forceps to detach piece by piece.

I need scarcely say that such a disease could not have had existence at the time of his enlistment, but was induced during his term of service.

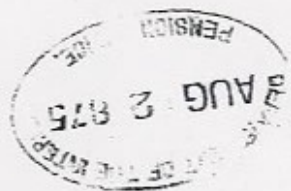
