

CO DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION. CO

STATE OF Kentucky COUNTY OF Estill SS:

On this 8th day of May A. D. 1894 personally appeared before me the undersigned duly authorized to administer oaths within the County and State aforesaid, Mary A. Mc Intosh

aged 62 years, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Nashville Mc Intosh who enlisted under the name of Nashville Mc Intosh

in Co. F of the 14 Regiment of Ky. Cav. Vols. and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was honorably discharged and died on the 18th day of April 1872

That she was married to said soldier under the name of Mary Ann Johnston on the — day of — 1852 by Rev Thomas H. Baeson at my Father's on Estill Co Ky

there being no legal barrier to said marriage, and neither of them or her husband were previously married, state law if was dissolved, or if neither were not married before as state here.

That she has not remarried since the death of said soldier above named and is without other means of support than her daily labor. That the names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the said soldier are as follows:

That she has made application under #548063 for an application for pension for said soldier under the Act of June 27, 1890.

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. That she appoints P. J. Lookwood, of Washington, D. C., her attorney to prosecute this claim and agrees to pay him a fee of ten dollar therefor if successful. That her Post Office address is Swain County of Estill State of Ky.

Mc Intosh the claimant, sign her name (or make her mark) to the foregoing declaration; that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of said claimant, and their acquaintance with her of Ten years and 5 years respectively that she is the identical person she represents herself to be; and that they have no interest direct or indirect in the prosecution of this claim.

On this 20 day of April A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty three

personally appeared before me Charles of the Estill County Court a Court of

aged 57 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Nash-

ville M. Intosh who was ENROLLED on the 12 day of

Aug 1864 in company F commanded by Captain J. Hall

of the 1st regiment of Ky Cav Volunteers, and was honorably DISCHARGED at

Camp Nelson Ky on the 24 day of Mar 1864

That while a member of the organization aforesaid, in the service and in the line of his duty, at

State Creek in the State of Ky on or about the

June 15 1863 he contracted Chronic Medi-

rhoea. Mucous of breast (Heat disease) &

pestige from which he still suffers &

for which pension is claimed.

That he was treated in hospitals as follows: Booneville Ky. & the

Regimental Surgeons Trimmer

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That since leaving the service this applicant has resided in the County of Estill

in the State of Ky and his occupation has been that of a farmer

That prior to his entry into the service above named he was a man of good sound physical health, being when en-

rolled a farmer That he is now very much disabled

from obtaining his subsistence by manual labor, by reason of his injuries above described, received in the

service of the United States, and he therefore makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the

invalid pension roll of the United States. He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

W. T. FITZGERALD, of Washington, D. C., his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim. That he has
